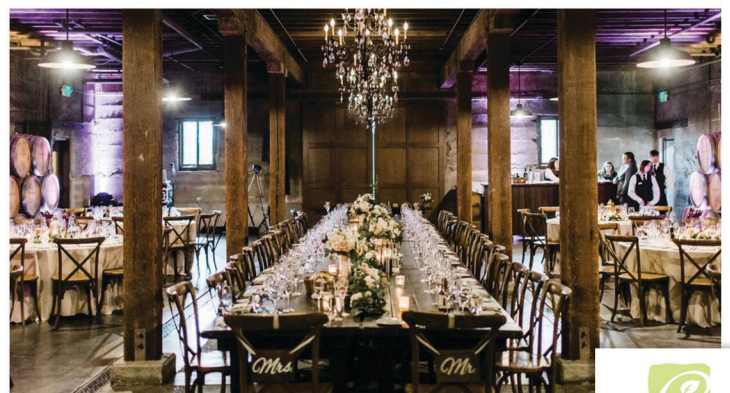
Brianna and Christian Leano were seeking a sense of magic for their wedding day. The vision: timeless, simple, elegant.
